Reports of Officers, Boards and Committees:

a. Cemetery Advisory Board: Minutes were provided for the June 30, 2021 meeting. Dave Houghtelling reported on the City's assistance in installing the new flag pole by the statute.

b. Library Board: Minutes were provided for the June 16, 2021, meeting. Discussion was held on the asbestos remediation as the City does not qualify for the grant. Council will discuss this situation again at budget time.

c. Sunny Hillside Schoolhouse Museum News: Tours have been given and the building was open for Medicine Creek Days. Many visitors have attended and positive comments were received.

d. Utility Supervisor Report – Dave Houghtelling reported on the following: Figgins Construction will start street work in Cambridge around July 12; the Cemetery has been sprayed for sandburs; the ditch has been sprayed; and the contractor for the swimming pool project is having materials delivered.

e. Clerk/Treasurer Report – Kandra Kinne reported on the following: three mowing letters have been sent; and a resident asked that Council limit hours for fireworks.

Unfinished Business:

a. Nuisance Abatement – Council received an agreement and a map from West Central Nebraska Development District. Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Derek Raburn, to approve the Nuisance Abatement Agreement Repeat Offender Program 2021 with map between the City of Cambridge and West Central Nebraska Development District, Inc. in the amount of \$7,525.00. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf. Mike Harris was absent and not voting. Motion carried by City Council members present for approval of the Agreement between the City and West Central Nebraska Development District.

B. Net Metering – Dave Houghtelling has a meter for net metering as Twin Valleys PPD is asking for a separate meter for demand. The City's software will need to be updated.

c. Ambulance Bids – Cambridge rescue is reviewing the bid received and finding prices for equipment for the new ambulance. Cambridge Rescue plans to present costs to purchase and equip new ambulance at the next meeting on July 19, 2021.

d. Application to Move/Remove House – An Application form was presented to Council which addresses accessory building(s) when a house has been moved or removed. Discussion was held regarding this being a conditional use permit or that the property should be leveled and cleared. Jeff Ommert stated the motion, seconded by Kevin Banzhaf, to approve the Application for Moving Permit form which addresses these issues. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf. Mike Harris was absent and not voting. Motion carried by City Council members present.

e. Conditional Use of an Existing Building – Council discussed a suggestion received from Miller & Associates to address accessory building(s) after the primary structure is demolished or removed from the property. Council decided to ask the Planning Commission to address this recommendation to R-1 and R-2 Districts.

New Business:

a. Brad Williams discussion to request Modification to Cambridge Zoning Regulation 12-102 – Brad Williams was present to ask Council to change zoning to three acres as the smallest parcel to be exempt from the subdivision regulations. City Attorney Lisa Shifflet will research other community regulations.

b. Mayor and City Council Comments – A land bank meeting is scheduled for July 15 in McCook. Tony Groshong asked if the old well pump could be used for dewatering as residents are pumping water out of their basements.

c. Public Comments - None

Adjournment: Kevin Banzhaf stated the motion, seconded by Derek Raburn, to adjourn City Council Meeting at 7:45 P.M. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf. Mike Harris was absent and not voting. Motion carried by City Council members present.
