Reports of Officers, Boards and Committees.

Miller & Associates - Downtown Revitalization Project:

Miller & Associates had advised that Blessing Construction is moving into town and barricades will be up tomorrow.

Ambulance/Fire Reports. No report.

<u>Planning Commission Reports.</u> The Planning Commission will meet on September 11.

<u>Utility Supervisor.</u> Dave Houghtelling reported that the water pipe was repaired on Flannery Avenue and there was an electrical outage on Monday, September 2 caused by a downed limb. City staff has drained the pool and closed it for the season. The Splash Pad is open for a few more days he advised. Work was done on curb stands for water shutoffs downtown before the project starts.

<u>Clerk/Treasurer:</u> Kandra Kinne gave a written report, updating the City Council on the nuisance abatement program, Cambridge Volunteer Fire has filed Articles of Incorporation with the Nebraska Secretary of State, sent a reminder to the engineer for a contract to start amending city limits, advised of an unpaid utility, but the party has contacted the city about a plan to make payments. The budget workshop will be on September 9 at 6:30 p.m.

Unfinished Business.

Heritage Plaza Survey: The final reading of the Ordinance vacating a portion of the street was read by title. Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Jeff Ommert to approve Ordinance #765 on final reading. On roll call vote Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Tom McCarville voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously for Ordinance No. 765 as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 765

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY OF A PORTION OF NELSON STREET AS PLATTED IN HAMMONDS ADDITION REPLACE NO 1, IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE, FURNAS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, AND RETAINING TITLE THERETO IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE, NEBRASKA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE, FURNAS COUNTY, NEBRASKA THAT:

Section 1. The following public right-of-way, namely:

A portion of Nelson Street as platted in Hammonds Addition Replat No.1, in the City of Cambridge, Furans County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest corner of lot 1, Block 1 of said Hammonds Addition Replat No 1; thence N89°49″38″E(assumed and all bearings used in this description are relative to) on the North line of said Nelson Street a distance of 414.52 feet; Thence continuing on said North line on the arc of a curve to the left whose chord bears N69°00″46″E, having a central angle 41°37′43″, a radius of 75.00 feet and an arc length of 54.49 feet to the Point of Beginning; Thence continuing on said North line on an arc of a curve to the left whose chord bears N34°38′34″E, having a central angle of 27°06′41″, a radius of 75.00 feet and an arc length of 35.49 feet; Thence continuing on said North Line on a curve to the right whose chord bears N48°48′03″ W, having a central angle of 55°25′41″, a radius of 150.00 feet and an arc length of 139.52 feet; Thence leaving said North line S00°38′14″E, a distance of 9.00 feet; Thence S48°11′55″W a distance of 167.77 feet to the Point of Beginning. Said tract containing 0.06 acres more or less, subject to any easements, rights-of-way or reservations of record.

Be and the same is hereby vacated subject to title of said public right-of-way being vacated remaining in the City of Cambridge, Furnas County, Nebraska.

Section 2. The proposed vacation is hereby found to be in the best interest of the City of Cambridge, Nebraska.

Section 3. All other ordinances or sections of ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication of posting of this ordinance and in conflict with its provisions are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication or posting as required by law.

Assisted Living Facility Easement/Heritage Plaza Survey: A utility easement is necessary between the properties of the Plaza and the Assisted Living Facility. Also, a survey might change the boundaries

between the two facilities. Attorney Shifflet will draft the documents. Derek Raburn stated the motion, seconded by Tom McCarville to approve the utility easement, subject to change. On roll call vote Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Derek Raburn and Tom McCarville voted yes, Keith Luedders abstained, and none voted no. Motion carried. Vernita stated the motion, seconded by Tony Groshong to approve the survey. On roll call vote Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Derek Raburn and Tom McCarville voted yes, Keith Luedders abstained, and none voted no. Motion carried.

Lance Shifflet Project – Shifflet explained his proposed project which would be located outside the City limits – a 80×200 warehouse with a 40×40 office; seed, no chemicals; water line goes to above pasture; no sewer line nearby. Shifflet is asking for water from the City. This will be an agenda item at the next meeting
