Miller and Associates Report – Downtown Revitalization Project Drawdown #11. The City council received a copy of the drawdown #11 for General Administration in the amount of \$2,500.00. Derek Raburn stated the motion, seconded by Vernita Saylor, to approve Drawdown #11 in the amount of \$2,500.00. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Swimming pool Project</u> – The Swimming Pool Committee has met and are working on advertising opportunities.

Economic Development Report. Melissa Jackson was present to give a report. Melissa reported a meeting is set up with Jake and Carmon Swisher to discuss renting property from the City of Cambridge. The Perkins Foundation gave a donation to the Economic Development Board to be used in their Home Town Competiveness Account for Down Payment Assistance. Jackson Johnson and Andy Benson are under construction in Harvest Meadows. Andy Benson is interested in building another spec house. Melissa said they are researching other ways to use LB840 fund, looking into daycare options, received applications for the Economic Development Position. Interviews are set up for November 22, 2019. The Board is looking into grand re-opening ideas for the downtown businesses, to be done around the holidays. Melissa attended a seminar and Hastings Economic Development has done a lot to revitalize downtown. The Economic Development Board is looking into ideas from the City of Hastings for downtown revitalization.

<u>Utility Supervisor Reports</u> - Utility Supervisor David Houghtelling reported he has received questions about locations of handicapped ramps in the downtown project. Dave reported handicapped ramps will be installed in location that will meet Americans with Disabilities Act. Ramps cannot exceed a 2% slope. Dave reported he has made arrangements to clean the drainage ditch and re-slope the sides. The contractor will clean out 4 foot in the east end and trees will be removed. The downtown project could be completed by November 15<sup>th</sup>.

<u>City Clerk Treasurer Report –</u> Kandra reported staff have started planning for the annual audit, training in utility billing, bank reconciliation have continued. The Painting is completed in the office and staff are looking at flooring, planning to update and paint public restrooms yet this fall and winter and plan to paint the community room next spring.

<u>Lance Shifflet Project.</u> - City Council reviewed a proposed agreement. The City Council asked for amendment to change the time period to 15 years. Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Jeff Ommert, to approve a Water Supply Agreement between the City of Cambridge and Western Select Genetic, LLC and authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Residents – Norton Street discuss option for storm drain ditch.</u> Colleen Johnson and Colleen Vandegrift were present to ask the City Council what maintenance is planned on the drainage ditch. The ditch will be cleaned up by spring, clean out the east end of the ditch and burn out weeds. The residents asked about using dirt removed from the ditch for a berm on the north side of the ditch for residential properties.

<u>Besler Industries – Request for Sewer Service.</u> City Council discussed needing information to calculate the monthly sewer rate, hooking into the City main on the North side of the Hospital at the intersection of Butler Drive and Nasby Street. The City Council discussed options to annex or not annex Besler

Industries. The City council asked for a contract for the service and noted Besler will be receiving two services from the City of Cambridge. The City Council asked for assistance from Craig Bennett of Miller and Associates about annexation issues.

<u>Tri Valley Health System Report.</u> Jessica Fischer, CEO of Tri Valley Health System, reported they are close to completing the easements for the Heritage Plaza. FEMA will be in Cambridge to assist with figuring out issues the Hospital has with storm draining. They are renovating the D & C Wings of the Heritage Plaza to make three bedroom apartments and that they are getting calls to rent apartments.

<u>NPPD PCA Refund -</u> The City Council reviewed the information provided by Twin Valleys Public power District. The City Council decided it is in the best interest of the City of Cambridge to keep the PCA Refund to use for the projects to upgrade the electric service from the generators to the light plant.

<u>Agreement with MEDC Corporation – for workforce housing project/grant.</u> The City Council received a copy of the proposed agreement with MEDC Corporation for a workforce housing project/grant. The City Council reviewed the agreement and did not have any questions.

<u>Employee Recognition Dinner -</u> The City Council decided to set the employee dinner for December 13 or 14, 2019 at Town Talk if space is available.

<u>Employee Bonus -</u> Tony Groshong stated the motion, seconded by Vernita Saylor, to approve employee bonus \$300.00 net for City Staff, Library, Museum, Park Maintenance and Cemetery Maintenance staff. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Utility Refund -</u> Keith Luedders stated the motion, seconded by Derek Raburn, to approve \$5.00 to all utility customers and an additional \$5.00 to customer who have Holiday Lighting. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Audit Contract</u>- Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Tony Groshong, to approve the contract with Contryman Associates to audit the City Finances for the fiscal year 2018-2019. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Adjournment</u> – The City Council set their next regular meeting for Thursday November 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 P.M. Keith Luedders stated the motion, seconded by Derek Raburn, to adjourn at 8:49 P.M. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Tony Groshong, Jeff Ommert, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf voted yes, none voted no. Motion carried unanimously.
