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Miller and Associates Reports. Mark McCurdy was present for the downtown businesses to discuss the length of time for the downtown revitalization project. Mark said he talked to some businesses and received feedback that they are frustrated that at times there is no activity by the contractor to complete the project. The project is having an impact on the businesses affected by the project. Mark said that during good weather residents were willing to come downtown and park and walk to the businesses in the construction area, but during bad weather residents are not willing to come downtown. Mark encouraged the City Council and the Economic Development to look at hardship grants for the retail businesses. Derek Downer explained the Economic Development Board is in the process of adopting an application for the businesses.

<u>Planning Commission Report.</u> The City Council receive the Planning Commission Report prior to this meeting. Derek Raburn stated the motion, seconded by Kevin Banzhaf, to approve the Planning Commission report. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf,

none voted no and Tony Groshong and Jeff Ommert were absent and not voting. Motion carried unanimously by City Council Members present for the following site plan and land use permit applications – Jackson Johnson, 40311 Harvest Drive – garage.

City Clerk/Treasurer Report. Kandra reported the City has received notice of a Nebraska Advantage Tax Refund of \$9,376.85 to be refunded in October 2020. Kandra reported \$48,884.25 will be refunded in 2020. Miller and Associates have researched funding to line the City's drainage ditch and this type of project could possibility be funded by NEMA with a 75%/25% cost share. Virginia Roberts is gathering information for Cemetery Records. The Economic Development Board is working on an application for downtown businesses that have been affected by the DTR Project and suggested the City provide some kind of assistance with utility bills for those businesses affected by the project. Kandra received notice to correct the levy for the budget fiscal year 2019-2020 and has submitted the correction. The budget has been approved by the State Auditor's Office. Kandra has published the Occupation Tax Report as required in LB445. Miller and Associates have submitted the 1-6 Year Street Plan and associated Resolutions to the Department of Transportation.

<u>Tri Valley Health System Report.</u> Jessica Fischer reported that she will have easements approved by their attorney for the Heritage Plaza. Jessica said she should be able to bring them to the next City Council meeting. The Heritage Plaza will potential be full. Jessica offered to give tours of the updates made at the Plaza. The Senior Center lunches are going well. The Hospital had over 300 attend the annual soup supper at the Plaza.

Agreement with MEDC Corporation for the workforce housing project/grant with the City of Benkelman, City of McCook and City of Cambridge. The City Council received a copy of the MEDC agreement and asked for some revisions. Keith Luedders stated the motion, seconded by Derek Raburn, to approve the MEDC Agreement pending changes in the title and signature line. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf, none voted no and Tony Groshong and Jeff Ommert were absent and not voting. Motion carried unanimously by City Council Members present.

<u>Besler Industries Agreement for Service.</u> The City Council discussed the pros and cons of annexation of Besler Industries. Jessica Fischer indicated Tri Valley Health System would agree to annex the field next to the hospital if the City would proceed with annexation of Besler Industries.

<u>Shifflet Water Agreement.</u> The City Council reviewed the agreement and did not have an objection to the number of years. Mayor Gunderson would talk to Lance Shifflet about the number of years in the contract and sign the contract.

<u>Conflict of Interest.</u> Kevin Banzhaf signed a conflict of interest statement because he has an open Nuisance Abatement case at 201 Paxton Street.

<u>Executive Session to discuss re-organization in December</u>. Keith Luedders stated the motion, seconded by Vernita Saylor, to approve going into executive session at 7:20 P.M. for the purpose to discuss re-organization. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf, none voted no and Tony Groshong and Jeff Ommert were absent and not voting. Motion carried unanimously

by City Council Members present. Keith Luedders stated the motion, seconded by Vernita Saylor, to return to regular meeting at 8:35 P.M. . Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Keith Luedders, Derek Raburn and Kevin Banzhaf, none voted no and Tony Groshong and Jeff Ommert were absent and not voting. Motion carried unanimously by City Council Members present. Mayor Gunderson stated the only items discussed in executive session were re-organization of the City Government for the next year.
